- I love coffee, giraffes and sewing

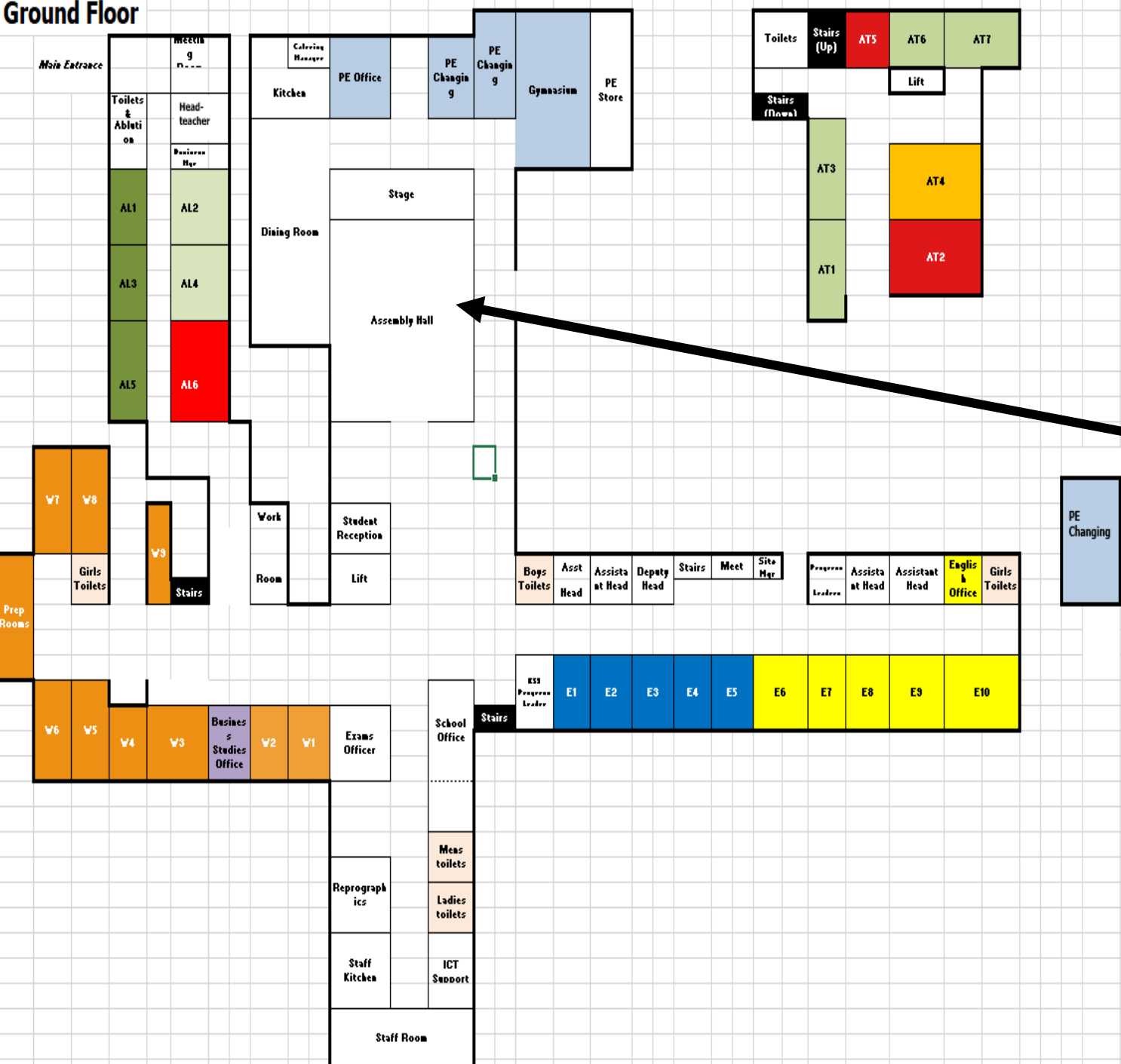
What are Year 6s most worried about?

- Getting into trouble

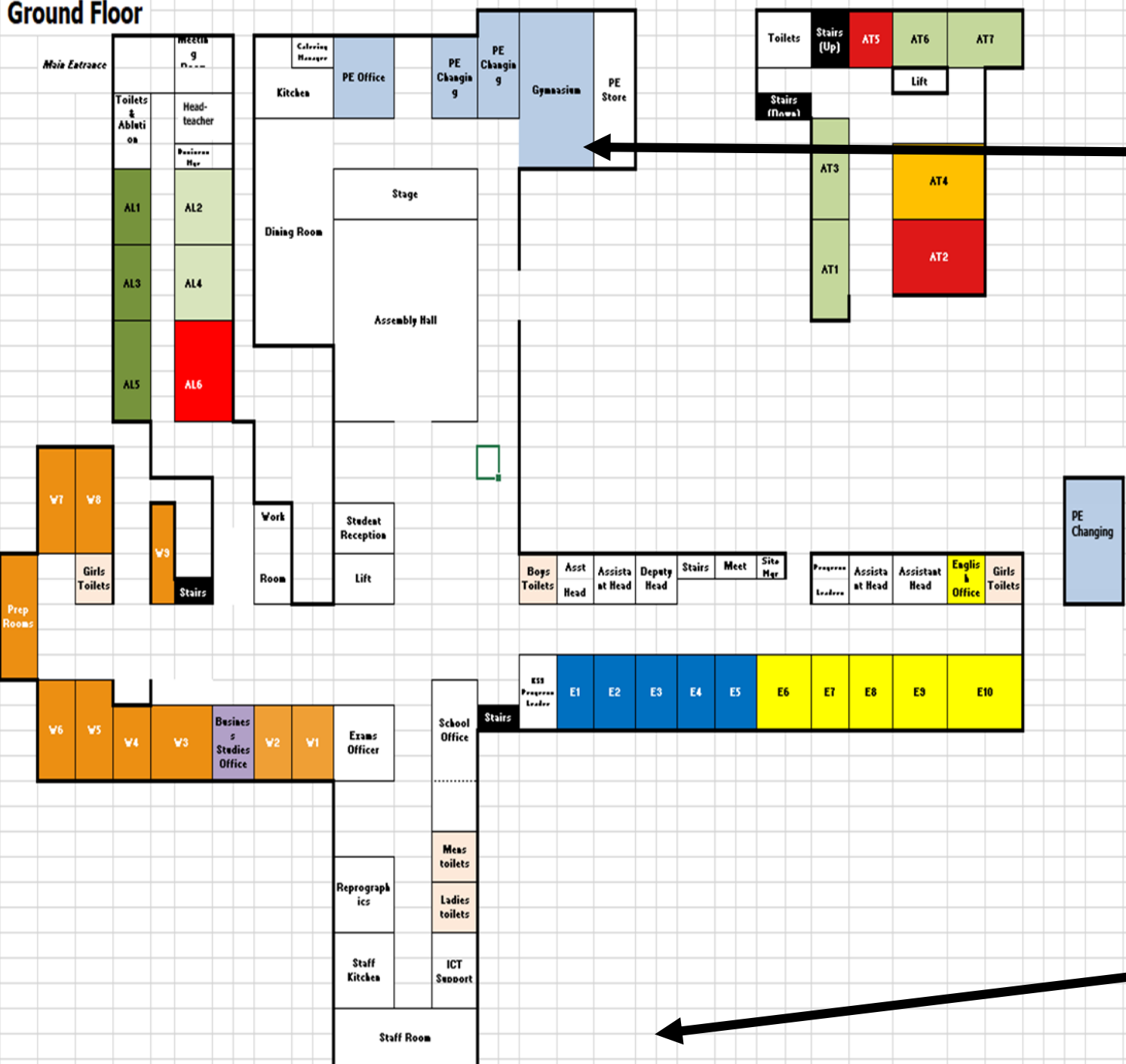
Transition means change

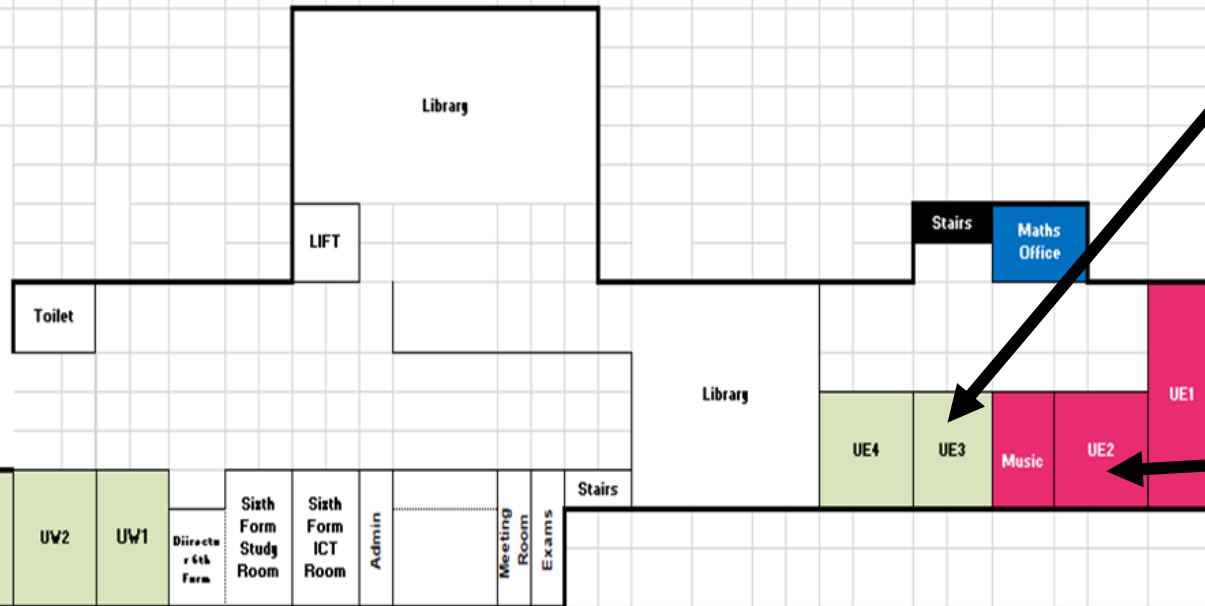
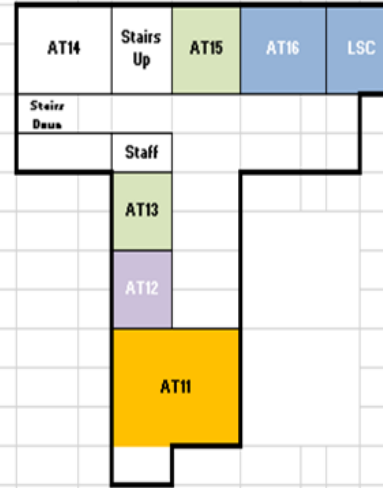
MAIN BUILDING - First Floor

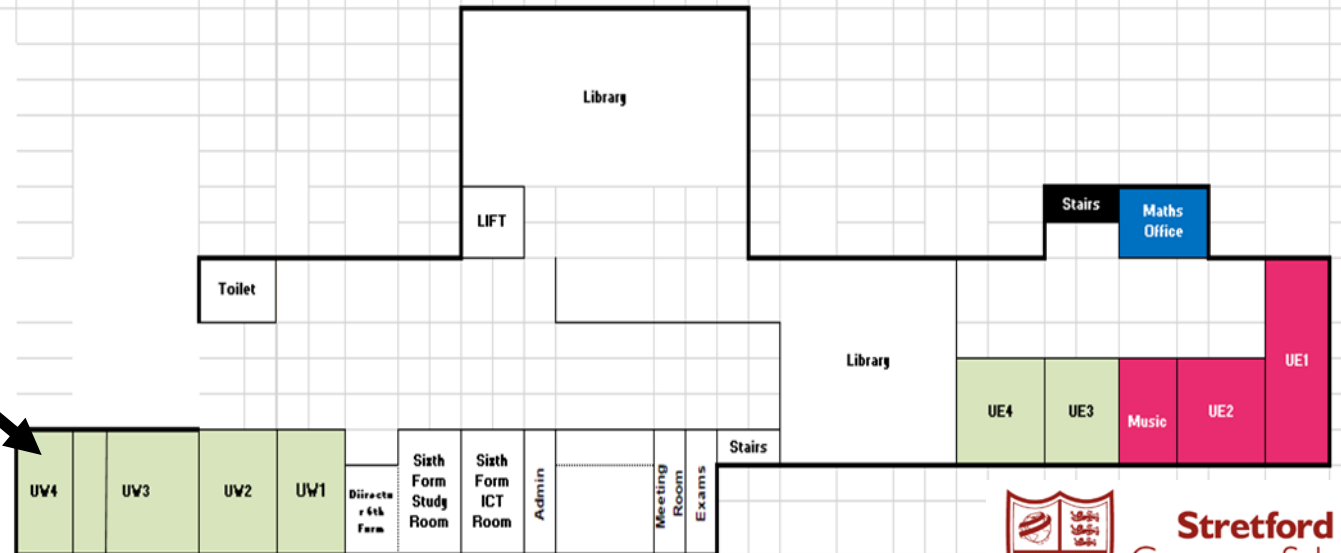
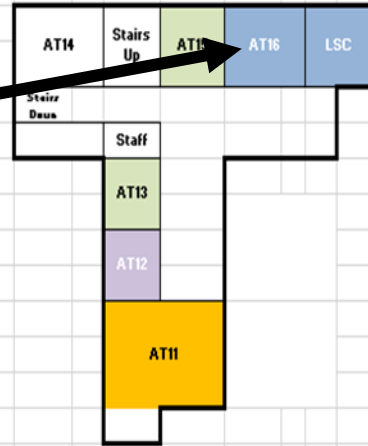

Homework

	<p>Decide how you will be travelling to school in September and practise your route. Make sure you know where the safe crossing points are, where you have get off the bus/tram and anywhere you might have to change transport.</p>
	<p>Complete the summer challenge activities. The shoebox challenge is all about you and the bingo challenge gives you some fun activities to do whilst earning Value Points for when you start in September!</p>
	<p>Make sure you have all of your uniform and your PE ready and labelled with your name in – this is so important!</p>
	<p>Make sure you have a full set of stationery (you are not allowed to share and borrow things at the moment) so that you are able to complete classwork tasks.</p>
	<p>Check with your parents that your online account is set up. It will need to have some money added to it if you are having school lunches as we have a cashless catering system. There may also be payment items for September that you need such as your Art Book and Maths Calculator.</p>
